

BLUE CARDJunior Age Groups Only

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A Junior Player who displays unsportsmanlike behaviour or is deemed to require a "cool off" at the discretion of the field Umpire may be ordered from the Field of Play by an Umpire under a blue card.

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Where a blue card is different to a yellow card, all Players who are ordered from the Field of Play with a blue card can be replaced immediately.

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E-POINTS SYSTEM Rule 16.4.2

E-POINTS SYSTEM

The goal of the E-Points is to promote a fun, safe and respectful match day environment. It is a penalty-based system where poor match day behaviour from Players, Officials and Supporters negatively impacts their Team's ladder position with the loss of "points for". It actively incentivises Clubs to ensure that measures are in place to ensure their members exhibit positive conduct during match days.

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It is important to acknowledge that an appropriate response to issue management is only one part of the E-Points System. Beyond the management of behavioural issues, an improved and more enjoyable environment for all can reflect in a Club's capacity to retain Players and recruit Volunteer support.

E-POINTS SYSTEM

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Minimum qualifications updated in the National Policy Handbook last year and require all First Aiders to register as a "Medical Officer" on PlayHQ.



As per the National Policy Handbook:

Clubs must ensure that at each Match or training session:

- at least one Sports Trainer or First Aid Provider with Appropriate Minimum Qualifications (see Section 15.3) for the relevant level of Australian Football is in attendance;
- a first aid kit and adequate sport-specific rescue/transport equipment (e.g. stretcher) are available;
- and there is marked venue access for emergency vehicles.

A Sports Trainer or First Aid Provider must hold a current Working With Children Check (WWCC) or otherwise meet the working with children requirements for NSW.

Minimum	AFL First Aider or Qualified Medical Professional



AFL First Aider means a person who has:

- (A) obtained a nationally accredited first aid and CPR qualification which is current and up-to-date and includes assessed competencies HLTAID011 (Provide First Aid) and HLTAID009 (Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation); and
- (B) has completed the AFL First Aid and Concussion Management online module within the previous 12 months.

HLTAID011 (Provide First Aid) remains valid for 3 years after completion. HLTAID009 Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation remains valid for 1 year (and must be renewed annually).

Qualified Medical Professional (QMP) means a person who:

- (A) is a qualified and AHPRA registered medical practitioner, paramedic, physiotherapist, or nurse with appropriate first aid competencies (including or equivalent to HLTAID00311 (Provide First Aid) and HLTAID009 (Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation); and
- (B) has completed the AFL First Aid and Concussion Management online module within the previous 12 months.

JUNIOR GALA DAYS IN 2025

Discussions with club volunteers during Planning Meeting and February meetings revealed:

- Preference for Gala Days to be conducted every 3 weeks rather than fortnightly.
